## THE UNIVERSITY

Jackson State University is one of the nation's premiere Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCUs), noted for its accomplishments in providing educational preparation to enable and empower graduates to succeed in an increasingly complex and competitive world. The seventh largest among the 117 HBCUs, and the fourth largest public institution in the State, Jackson State University provides programs at the baccalaureate, master's, specialist, and doctoral levels. In 1979, Jackson State University was officially designated the Urban University of the State of Mississippi. Located in Jackson, the State's largest urban area and its capital, the University is surrounded by a population of approximately 400,000 people in the metropolitan area.

As the Urban University in the State, Jackson State University is ideally positioned to provide

academic and public service programs to address issues and concerns in both urban and rural environments. The University emphasizes the development of persons who can and will assume prominent roles in the dynamics of societal growth and change. Thus, the establishment of degree and non-degree offerings, certification and training programs and the provision of technical assistance are evidence of the University's role in providing and physical resources human. cultural. in



communities throughout the State, the nation, and the world.

Jackson State University is in the forefront among Mississippi institutions of higher learning in increasing its graduate degree offerings in a variety of disciplines, a number of which resulted from the historic Avers desegregation case.

## THE SCHOOL OF HEALTH SCIENCES

## History

In July 2003, Jackson State University adopted a college structure. As a result, the School of Health Sciences, formerly the School of Allied Health Sciences, became one of three schools within the College of Public Service. The other two schools are the School of Policy and Planning and the School of Social Work. The departments and degree programs in the School of Health Sciences were established during the academic year 1998-1999 under the School of Allied Health Sciences. The Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning (IHL) approved the Bachelor of Science Degree in Healthcare Administration to be offered by the Department of Healthcare Administration and a Master of Science Degree in Communicative Disorders to be offered by the Department of Communicative Disorders. The Department of Public Health emerged as the third department offering a Master of Public Health (M.P.H.) Degree and admitted its first student cohort during the academic year 1999-2000.

The departments within the School of Health Sciences have progressively grown since their beginning in 1998. During the academic year 2004-2005, the School was reorganized into four departments: Health Policy and Management, Epidemiology and Biostatistics, Communicative Disorders, and Behavioral and Environmental Health. In addition, the School of Health Sciences has been approved by



IHL to offer the first and only Doctor of Public Health (Dr.P.H.) Degree Program in the State of Mississippi.

In 2012, the University consolidated the Public Health Program's three departments into three concentrations-based units. These units and Communicative Disorders are now housed in the School of Health Sciences.

The Dr.P.H. Program is accredited by the Council on Education for Public Health (CEPH) which accredits Public Health Programs and Schools of Public Health nationally.

The Department of Communicative Disorders is accredited by the *Council on Academic Accreditation in Audiology and Speech-Language Pathology of the American Speech-Language-Hearing Association (ASHA)* and offers a Master of Science in Communicative Disorders. The Department of Behavioral and Environmental Health offers the M.P.H. and Dr.P.H. degrees with concentrations in Behavioral Health Promotion and Education. The Department of Epidemiology and Biostatistics offers the M.P.H. and Dr.P.H. degrees with a concentration in Epidemiology. The Department of Health Policy and Management offers the B.S. Degree in Healthcare Administration and the M.P.H. and Dr.P.H. degrees with a concentration in Health Policy and Management.

## Philosophy

At a time when programs in public health are compelled to evolve because of scientific advances and increased understanding of determinants of health disparities, the Jackson State University School of Health Sciences emerged to educate students as leaders in local, national, and international organizations. Public health professionals will be able to communicate with diverse populations, understand the issues and concerns of underserved and minority populations, conduct research on health disparities in public health, and utilize effective collaborations and partnerships with communities to improve population health and make significant inroads in the reduction of health disparities. Jackson State University School of Health Sciences aspires to create leaders who will practice as professors, researchers, program designers, planners, administrators, evaluators, and other service providers. Public health education in the 21<sup>st</sup> century requires knowledge of informatics, policy and law, global health issues, cultural differences, genomics, public health values and ethics, and core public health competencies and skills. Thus, the philosophy of the School of Health Sciences is to prepare students to meet the changing and challenging environment of public health.

## School of Health Sciences Mission and Vision

The mission of the School of Health Sciences is to provide quality education and leadership in community-based research and practice. Through collaborative efforts with communities, the School promotes health and seeks to prevent disease and disability, with special emphasis on the underserved and at risk population in Mississippi, the nation, and the world.

The vision of the School of Health Sciences at Jackson State University is to take a leadership role, in partnership with the community, in understanding and eliminating the pervasive inequalities affecting the health and healthcare of racial and ethnic minorities and other historically underserved populations.

## THE DOCTOR OF PUBLIC HEALTH DEGREE PROGRAM

## MISSION

The mission of the Doctor of Public Health (Dr.P.H.) Degree Program is to prepare students at Jackson State University to become competent practitioners, research scientists and educators in different areas of public health including, but not limited to, behavioral health promotion and education, epidemiology, and health policy and management. Individuals with the Dr.P.H. degree can be expected to compete effectively in the job market and respond to the challenges posed by disparities in health and healthcare affecting minorities and other historically underserved populations. The program will provide students with a doctoral experience that is multidisciplinary, problem-centered, fully engaged, and integrative of the diverse elements needed in the education of the public health practitioner.

## CURRICULUM

The Dr.P.H. degree will provide a foundation of core and elective courses beyond the master's degree, which will prepare the student for leadership in public health research and/or practice. Students are required to complete a minimum of 45 credit hours plus 15 hours of dissertation. Students with an M.P.H. or master's degree in a public health-related discipline may transfer up to six credit hours as electives. The curriculum is divided into advanced core courses (21 credit hours), concentration

courses (15 credit hours), a community research practicum (3 credit hours), electives (6 credit hours), and a dissertation. The program will include advanced theoretical and practical studies in specialized fields of public health. Students will be educated to study public health from а multidisciplinary perspective. Graduates will master core competencies in public health as well as specialized courses in their chosen concentration. The curriculum will aid them in developing high level analytical (quantitative and qualitative) research skills, complemented by an extensive



breadth of relevant leadership knowledge in research grant preparation, management, study implementation and evaluation. (Please refer to Typical Course of Study --- Tables 1 and 2.)

## **Core Curriculum**

The core curriculum (i.e., advanced core courses) consists of 21 credit hours and is required for all concentrations. The core curriculum provides foundational information for research and practice that is relevant to each public health discipline. Courses include: Advanced Biostatistics and Computer Science Applications, Disease Pathogenesis and Risk Factors, Designing Research Studies on Minorities and Special Populations, Survey and Qualitative Research Methods, Advocacy and Public Health Policies, and Advanced Biostatistics Laboratory (I-III).

## Prerequisites

Students with a graduate degree other than public health must complete 15 hours of core PH courses (PHS 501-505) from the Master of Public Health core curriculum before enrolling in the doctoral level courses.

## Concentrations

The Dr.P.H. Degree is awarded in three concentrations – Behavioral Health Promotion and Education, Epidemiology, and Health Policy and Management. The concentrations and educational objectives are described below:

*Behavioral Health Promotion and Education* studies the role of behavioral (social and psychological) factors in disease causation, prevention, and health services, with application to public health education and promotion for the prevention of disease and injury. The objectives are to: develop, implement, and evaluate programs in health promotion and education through collaborative partnerships; establish and maintain community partnerships; apply theoretical perspectives in analyzing the behavioral, cultural and ethical dimensions of community health problems; identify and assess the determinants of community and population health, including social and behavioral factors contributing to health-related behaviors; and conduct scientific investigations.

# Table 2 Typical Course of Study: Concentration Courses (Student selects one concentration)

*Epidemiology* deals with methods for elucidating the causes of disease and evaluating health services, programs, and treatments. Students will be provided with the conceptual knowledge and statistical skills to study, analyze, and monitor the distribution and determinants of disease occurrence and other outcome measures in human populations. The educational objectives are to provide knowledge on methods for determining the causes of disease and for evaluating health services, programs, and treatments; develop concepts and statistical skills to conduct, study, analyze, and monitor the distribution and determinants of disease and other outcome measures; apply basic methodological skills to analyze discrete problems in health; acquire critical thinking for problem-solving and developing research protocols; and use the problem-solving approach for collection, analysis, and synthesis of data.

*Health Policy and Management* exposes students to a curriculum designed to provide them with skills of contemporary public health administration and management as well as analytical skills for designing, developing, implementing, and evaluating public health interventions, including financial and human resource management, comprehensive policy and program planning, analysis, evaluation, and implementation. Emphasis will be placed on learning that creates a b alance between comprehensive understanding and specialization, between theory and practice, and between academic inquiry and professional pragmatism. An innovative attitude toward current and future public health needs and issues is emphasized and explored through classroom instruction, group projects, and field studies. The educational objectives are to provide knowledge of the managerial process and functions of management; utilize state-of-the-art systems and tools in policy formulation and implementation and managerial decision–making; and critically evaluate current and future public health problems and to develop and implement sound policies.

## Electives

Electives (6 credit hours) expand students' knowledge base within a specific concentration. Although electives may be selected from other disciplines, including non-public health degree programs, they must be related to the concentration of interest and approved by the doctoral program advisors.

## **Comprehensive Examination**

In order to become a candidate for the Dr.P.H. degree, a student must pass a written comprehensive examination. The comprehensive examination must be passed prior to approval of the dissertation proposal. The examination will include core and concentration doctoral and courses. <u>An aggregate score of eighty percent or higher will be required for passing.</u>

## Dissertation

Students will complete doctoral level research that demonstrates an ability to conduct a rigorous research project within a specific concentration. The research topic, approved by the dissertation committee, should reflect the candidate's interest in a problem issue unique to public health. The completion of a minimum of 45 semester credit hours and successful completion of the comprehensive examination are required before enrolling in the dissertation course. Enrollment must be continuous until the research experience culminates in the successful defense of the dissertation.

## PRACTICUM REQUIREMENTS

Students are required to spend a minimum of 135 clock hours per semester in a community health research practicum. The research practicum, which begins the second year of enrollment, requires three continuous, one-semester hour courses that culminate in a capstone experience during the final semester. A written and oral presentation of the community research project and the submission of a manuscript to a refereed journal for publication are required for completion of the practicum. The community research practicum is based on research and public health issues related to each student's concentration. The practicum allows students to develop insight into planning their dissertations in a community oriented, public health setting.

## **COMPLETION TIME REQUIREMENTS**

Students must complete all degree requirements within eight years from the time of admission into the program. The actual amount of time for completion varies according to the student's progress in the program.

## FINANCIAL INFORMATION

Graduate students are required to make arrangements for expenses they incur during their graduate studies. These expenses include tuition and other fees required by the University and/or the academic units in which the students are enrolled.

## Tuition

Tuition fees are determined by the Board of Trustees of the State Institutions of Higher Learning and the Mississippi State Legislature. Information for the respective academic year may be obtained from the current University's Graduate Catalog.

## Residency

In order to meet the legal residency requirement in Mississippi, students must reside in the state for a continuous period of at least 12 months. They must meet this requirement prior to admission in order to qualify for in-state tuition fees.

## **Financial Assistance**

Graduate students are offered a number of options for financing their studies. They may apply for assistantships, scholarships, and fellowships through the Division of Graduate Studies and the School of Health Sciences. In addition, students may apply for loans and other financial assistance at the University's financial aid office and extramural funds. Applicants must request and submit required information for each respective type of financial assistance.

## **ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS**

Applicants must apply to the Division of Graduate Studies and to the Doctor of Public Health Degree Program in the School of Health Sciences. Admission to the Doctor of Public Health Degree Program is on a selective basis and is determined by the following criteria:

- □ Master of Public Health Degree or a master's degree in a related discipline in public health
- Admission to the Division of Graduate Studies at Jackson State University
- □ Academic promise as evidenced by above average achievements in undergraduate and graduate studies
- □ Satisfactory performance on the Graduate Record Examination (GRE) taken within the past five years
- □ Satisfactory performance on the Test of English as a F oreign Language (TOEFL) or the International English Language Standard Test (IELST) International Applicants Only
- □ Statement of purpose
- □ Curriculum vitae
- □ Three letters of recommendation (one professional and two academic references)
- □ Entrance interview (contingent upon initial assessment)

Transfer students must meet the same admission standards as all other applicants

- 2. Applicant must be enrolled full-time (9-12 hours) and in good standing with the University.
- 3. Two letters of recommendation sealed and submitted with application (one from community civic / service organization and from an academic professor).
- 4. Submission of Official transcript with application.
- 5. Two page typed Essay related to an important issue facing public health in the U.S. This must be your original work.
- 6. Specifications and Limitations of Scholarship
  - a. Applicant must be enrolled full-time (9-12 hours) during the academic year that the scholarship is awarded.
- 7. Specifications and Limitations of Assistantship
  - a. Applicant must be enrolled full-time (9-12 hours) during the academic year that the scholarship is awarded.
  - b. Assistantship will provide a bi-monthly stipend for 15-20 hours per week of service. Service hours are Monday-Friday, 8:00 a.m. 5:00 p.m.
- 8. Amount of both the scholarship and assistantship varies, depending on available funding.
- 9. All applications are reviewed by committee.
- 10. The scholarship and assistantship are renewable provided the student maintains the 3.35 GPA and reapply by April 30<sup>th</sup> deadline.
