



# Jackson Heart Study Graduate Training and Education Center Application 2015-2016

The Jackson Heart Study Graduate Training and Education Center (JHS GTEC) invites you to apply to the Daniel Hale Williams Scholars Program (DHWSP). The DHWSP is a robust education training certificate program focusing on building evidence-based approaches to training graduate students in cardiovascular epidemiology research. The goals are to enrich the educational experience of students and to prepare them for future careers in academics, industry, and government research settings; enhance the professional skills of graduate students to increase the likelihood of success and completion of graduate school; and increase the interest in and likelihood of, graduate students entering careers in biomedical sciences following degree and program completion.

The program is named after Dr. Daniel Hale Williams (1858-1931), the first African American physician admitted to the American College of Surgeons, who performed the first successful open heart surgery, founded the first interracial hospital, created two hospital-based training programs for nursing, and co-founded the National Medical Association. His accomplishments will serve as an inspiring model for all of our scholars.

We are now accepting applications for this **two-year research and education training program for the period** May 2015 through April 2017.

#### The application due date is Friday, April 8, 2016.

The program will consist of courses and guidance from a mentor (Learning Community Advisor) to develop a research project and submit a peer-reviewed publication. Scholars will be required to participate in regularly scheduled group activities and faculty developed discussions and lecturers that will enhance their knowledge and scientific technical skills, as well as gain expertise in cardiovascular epidemiology research. Participants in these activities will become stronger candidates for grant funding as independent investigators.

### **Eligibility Criteria/Requirements**

- Jackson State University (JSU) and University of Mississippi Medical Center (UMMC) students who are currently enrolled <u>full-time</u> in Sociology, Psychology, and Public Health graduate programs in Medicine, Nursing, Dentistry, and Pharmacy.
- Have a GPA of 3.50 or above.
- Have a two-year commitment to participate in the DHWS Program.

- Have an interest in cardiovascular research.
- Must be a U.S. Citizen.

All candidates must submit an application; CV or resume; personal statement; three (3) letters of recommendation from a faculty member, department head or dean; and an academic transcript. Submit all materials at one time.

#### **Program Summary**

- The DHWSP is a 2-year individualized mentored research training program.
- During Year 1, didactic training will be provided, with a focus on secondary data analysis and development of manuscripts for publication; and scholars will attend a Summer Research Training Program.
- During Year 2, the focus shifts to emphasize continued mentoring and submitting a manuscript for publication.
- Individual scholars will be provided a stipend (\$10,000).

As part of the individualized mentoring, each DHW scholar will develop a Scholar/Mentor Research Work Plan Agreement. The scholar and mentor will work together to set the scholar's personal DHWS goals based on the level the scholar has reached in his/her career.

- Minimal goals for Year 1 include: at least 85% attendance of DHWSP activities, timely submission of DHWSP reports, abstract submission, and presentation on Research Day Annual Conference on Eliminating Health Disparities.
- During Year 2, scholars will be expected to prepare at least one manuscript using JHS data to be submitted for publication.

- 6) Course in Cardiovascular Disease Epidemiology
