SPRING SEMESTER ENROLLMENT TRENDS 2008-2013 (Total Headcount/F.T.E.)

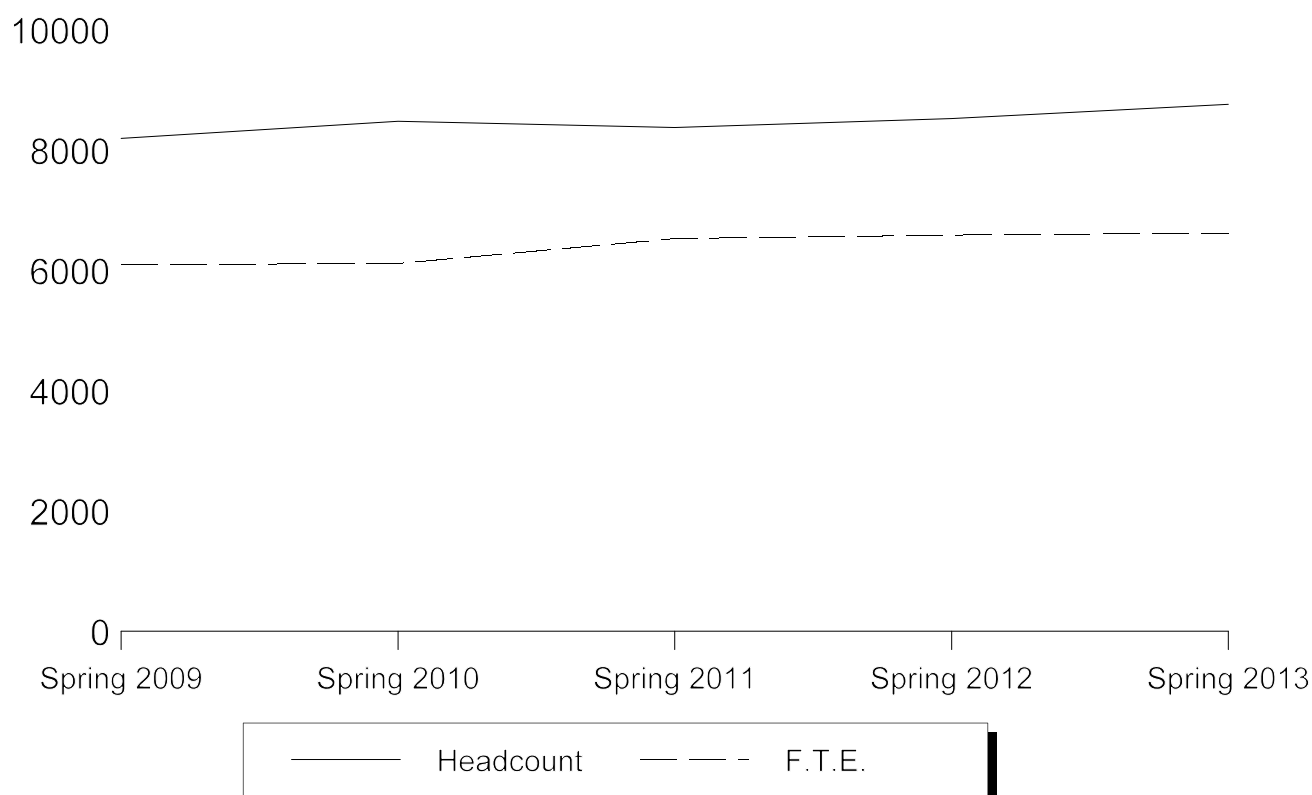
