



State Licensing Examination

Jackson State University’s College of Education and Human Development requires students to take a licensure examination to obtain a degree in the Teacher Education Program. This program requires students to successfully pass the PRAXIS II examination. Student performance over the past five years is presented in **Table 1** below. It can be seen from this information that the number of students tested fluctuates, ranging from a high of 60 students tested in years 2012-2013 and 2013-2014 to a low of 20 students tested in 2015-2016. Passage rates for students tested ranges from 82% to 100%. The most recent pass rate is 95% with 22 students who tested in 2017-18.
