Satisfactorily complete the curricular requirements in the major field. 3. Satisfactorily pass the Undergraduate English Proficiency Examination (UEPE) before 60 hours of credit is earned. No exceptions or waivers are granted. 4. First-time, first-year students must satisfactorily complete 120 hours of community service as approved by the University. Transfer students, who transfer 60 or more hours, must satisfactorily complete 60 hours of community service as approved by the University. 5. Meet all requirements and apply for Admission to Teacher Education: See Undergraduate Catalog, p. 99 6. Meet all requirements and apply for Admission to Student Teaching: See Undergraduate Catalog, p. 99 7. Earn a cumulative academic average of not less than 2.50 in all courses. 8. Earn a cumulative average of not less than 2.50 in all courses attempted in the major field. 9. Take all examinations required by the college and/or department for the student's major. 10.
