
Registration and Payment of Fees

- The cost for each workshop is \$200 for professionals and \$100 for students with valid identification. Parking at JSU-Madison is free. The fee includes handouts, gerontology certificate, and continuing education (approved for 6.0 CEUs for each session for social workers, LMFT, and Licensed Professional Counselors continuing education applied for) certificate if desired.
