(JACKSON, Miss.) – Jackson State University will host the 16th Conference on Current Trends in Computational Chemistry on Nov. 2-3 at the Hilton Jackson Hotel.

The symposium will cover all areas of computational and quantum chemistry. It will feature Dr. Rodney J. Bartlett, who teaches chemistry at the University of Florida. His research areas include quantum chemistry, molecular electronic structure and spectra.
