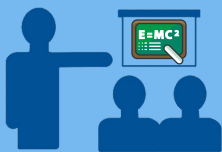


ACTIVE LEARNING STRATEGY: THINK-PAIR-SHARE

A collaborative learning strategy where students work together to solve a problem or answer a question about an assigned reading or a topic

GOAL: ENCOURAGE ACTIVE ENGAGEMENT

1 F2F ACTIVE LEARNING ACTIVITY



T (Think): Start by asking a specific question about a text or topic. Ask students to “think” about what they know or have learned about the topic.

P (Pair): Pair each student with another student or create a small group.

S (Share): Have students share their thoughts with partners and group members, and then as part of a whole-class discussion.

2 MODIFICATIONS FOR ONLINE SYNCHRONOUS

Use **breakout meeting rooms** in online video conferencing platforms to simulate small group discussions. Students can use **Google Docs** to type their questions or share their thoughts.



MODIFICATIONS FOR ONLINE ASYNCHRONOUS

Pose an equivalent question to the **asynchronous students**, either in video or text, and ask the students to respond in a small group discussion forum. The group reports can be shared to the larger class discussion forum.

4 MODIFICATIONS FOR PHYSICALLY-DISTANCED CLASSROOM

Set up small groups of 3-5 students. Can send groups out of class for **easier socially distanced** discussion elsewhere on campus with set return time. Students can use **Google Docs** to document their discussion. Students can return to class for whole-class discussion.
