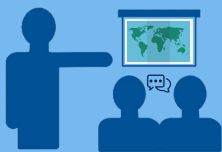


ACTIVE LEARNING STRATEGY: TURN AND TALK

A strategy that allows students to participate in discussions

GOAL: ENCOURAGE ACTIVE ENGAGEMENT

1 TRADITIONAL F2F APPROACH



Turn: Have students turn to a specific partner.

Talk: Set a timer for the allotted time, and have students begin discussing the assigned question or prompt.

When time is up, ask partners to **share** thoughts and ideas from their discussion.

2 MODIFICATIONS FOR ONLINE SYNCHRONOUS

Assign students to breakout meeting rooms in **Zoom** or **Google Meet**. Ask a question and let the students reply with a brief response using the chat feature in Google Meet or Zoom. Read them aloud to the whole class or assign a student in each room to be the reporter.



MODIFICATIONS FOR ONLINE ASYNCHRONOUS

Assign partners and pose a question to them. Have them share their ideas in a **Canvas discussion board**, email, or other tools like **Microsoft Flipgrid**.

4 MODIFICATIONS FOR PHYSICALLY- DISTANCED CLASSROOM

Assign partners in the classroom or other spaces on campus where they can talk from **6 ft apart**.

Alternatively, students can "talk" through chat features on Zoom or Google Meet or through a shared Google Doc.
