Pathway Themes

General Education Pathway (PATH) courses are courses that are connected through interdisciplinary themes and are selected at the student's discretion to fulfill the general education curriculum. Through experiential learning and reflective writing, students will have the opportunity to integrate knowledge across courses, develop their skills and an enhanced sense of civic responsibility. Students select nine (9) hours from the pathway of choice. Each pathway concludes with a related one (1) credit hour a University Required (UR) course.

University Academic Advisement Center

The University Academic Advising Center (UAAC) is here to guide you through your academic journey. The UAAC's Academic Advisors provides academic guidance and related services to students with 0-59 credits (Freshman and Sophomore classifications). Students are assigned to an advisor based on their major. Students with 60+ credits are assigned to a faculty advisor in the major academic department. This model is designed to strengthen the connection between students' experience in Academic Advisement and that of their department so that they receive the benefit of faculty mentorship as well as professional advisement services.

Students can schedule a thirty-minute appointment to speak with their assigned academic advisor or "walk-in" to utilize our fifteen-minute fast-track available advisor service. Each Academic Advisor assists students with the following:

- Developing academic and professional goals during their undergraduate college experience and beyond
- Understanding the purpose of general education and its relation to curricula

- Degree Mapping four-year degree plan
- Utilizing Degree Works advising/graduation audit system
- Identifying and assisting with resolving academic issues related to grades, academic progress, and degree completion.
- Addressing personal, social, and financial issues which serve as barriers to academic success.
- Creating an Academic Action Plan if student is having academic difficulties.
