Master of Professional Accountancy (MPA)

The MPA degree is awarded by the Division of Graduate Studies through the Department of Accounting. The program emphasizes advanced topics in accountancy. Students with undergraduate degrees in majors other than Accounting must complete certain prerequisite courses to enter this program. Details are provided on the next page. Students interested in becoming CPAs should consider MPA studies because accountancy laws in many states require 150 collegiate-level hours to sit for the CPA examination. This law became effective in Mississippi in 1995. The MPA curriculum consists of 30 hours of specific graduate course work as follows:
