Visually Impaired	Assistive devices needed: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Optical character recognition system (also known as a scanner with speech output) • Text-based web browser with screen reading software or Braille output. • Accessible company websites – CCTV (Closed Circuit Television System) • iPad • Braille 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Large-print materials • Qualified reader • Computer with voice output • note taker • Screen magnification product. • Optical magnifier • Large-print label • Raised lettering on room labels • Note taker
