

Licensure Disclosure for Bachelor of Science in Elementary Education

Current qualifications for a Mississippi State Department of Education Educator Licensure are:

In compliance with Miss. Code Ann. §37-3-2, as amended by Mississippi Laws 1997, Ch. 545, the Commission on Teacher and Administrator Education, Certification and Licensure and Development and the State Board of Education have approved the following guidelines for licensure:

- 1. Education: Bachelor's degree or higher in Teacher Education with documentation of completion of student teaching from a state approved or NCATE/CAEP accredited program from a regionally/nationally accredited institution of higher education.
- 2. National Teacher Licensure Examination: The applicant should have passed the Praxis Core Academic Skills for Educators examination *or* hold a GPA of 3.0 on a minimum of 60-hours of course credits as established by the State Board of Education *or* earn an ACT score of 21 or higher; and Praxis Subject Assessment, Praxis Principles of Learning & Teaching, and Foundations of Reading Assessment.

- (A) A list of all States for which the institution has determined that its curriculum meets the State educational requirements for licensure or certification;
- (B) A list of all States for which the institution has determined that its curriculum does not meet the State educational requirements for licensure or certification; and
- (C) A list of all States for which the institution has not made a determination that its curriculum meets the State educational requirements for licensure or certification.
