The Department of Educational Administration, Foundations, and Research provides graduate degree programs at the master's, specialist, and doctoral levels. The curriculum for each meets all the qualifications and licensure requirements that enable graduates to successfully pass standardized tests for administrator's licenses.

After candidates graduate from an approved master's level, specialist level, and doctoral degree program in Educational Leadership, the State of Mississippi requires graduates seeking an administrative license to pass the School Leadership Licensure Assessment (SLLA). The Test Code is 6990. Nineteen (19) states including Mississippi require passing the SLLA (test codes and passing scores may vary from state to state).

The states/territories that require the SLLA are Arkansas, Colorado, Connecticut, District of Columbia, Kansas, Kentucky, Louisiana, Maine, Maryland, Mississippi, Nebraska, New Jersey, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, South Dakota, Tennessee, Utah, Vermont, and Virginia as well as Guam, and U.S. Virgin Islands.
