- 5. Earn a cumulative academic average of not less than 2.00 ("C") in all courses.
- 6. Earn a grade of "C" or above in all departmental and major courses (PS).
- 7. Satisfy requirements for removing an incomplete grade ("I") the next semester after the grade is assigned.
