Academic Overview

According to the U.S. Constitution, there should be a Separation of Church and State; thus providing that U.S. laws and public policies that govern U.S. citizens do not infringe upon the citizens' right to practice the religion of their choice. It also provides that a U.S. citizen's religious beliefs and practices are not dictated by U.S. policy makers' religious beliefs and practices. "The Politics of Public Policy and the Infusion of Religiosity as a Paradigm in Public Policy Creation and Implementation" researches and examines whether or not there is a positive correlation between Public Policy and the infusion of Religiosity as a Paradigm. Upon completion of the course, students will learn about the Transhistoricity of the Coercion of Politics, Public Policy, and Religiosity, understand the realities and consequences of public policies designed based upon a religious perspective and discover how the political, religious, and social structures have shaped the development of different cultures.

About The City

Located on the continent of Europe, Barcelona, Spain is the capital of Catalonia and is a Mediterranean and cosmopolitan city with Roman remains, medieval quarters and the most beautiful examples of 20th century Modernism and avant-garde. A wide cultural program will take visitors to museums, exhibitions, and openair sculptures. The cathedral, episcopal palace, and churches bear witness to Barcelona's importance as a religious center. It became an important religious center before the arrival of the Moors in AD 717.

Program Overview

Passport to the World takes place during the first summer term at JSU. Prior to leaving for Barcelona, classes will be conducted in an online course format with the use of JSU Canvas. After return from Barcelona, students will work independently on the completion of a term paper, a topic selected with instructor approval. During the program, students will learn about the origin of the historicity of political institutions and the inclusive of religion as a paradigm in public policy creation and implementation.
