SPRING SEMESTER ENROLLMENT TRENDS 2004-2008 (Total Headcount/F.T.E.)

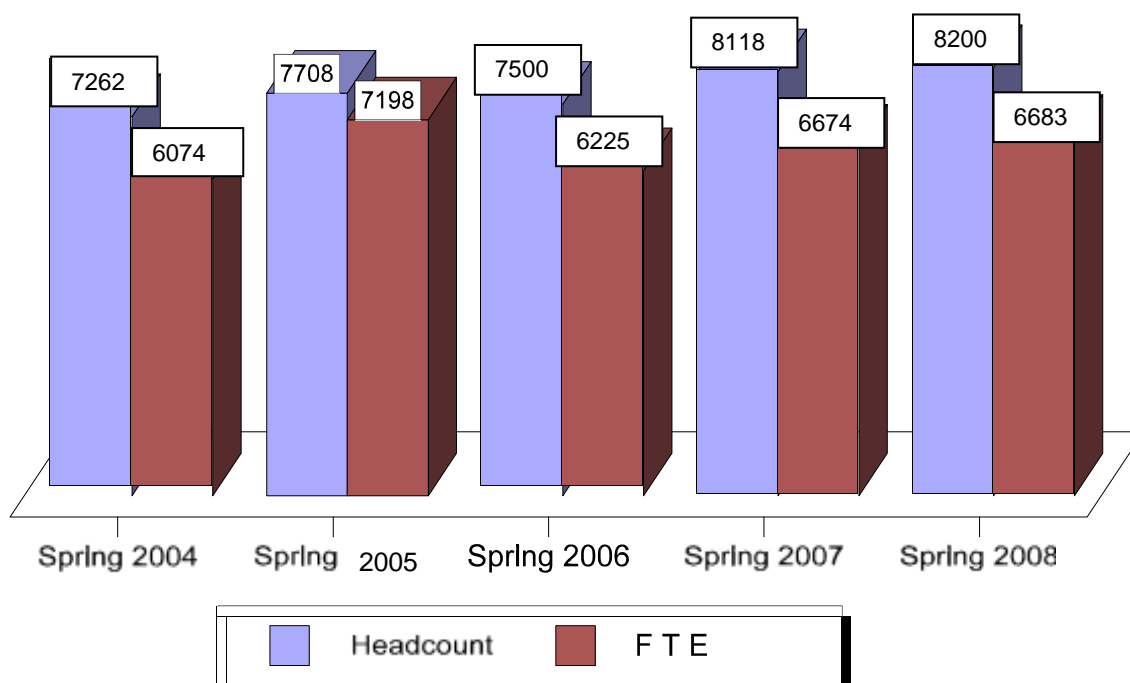
