In 1979, Jackson State University was designated the Urban University of the State of Mississippi. JSU now offers 45 bachelors', 34 masters', 1 specialist-in-education and 13 doctorate degrees.

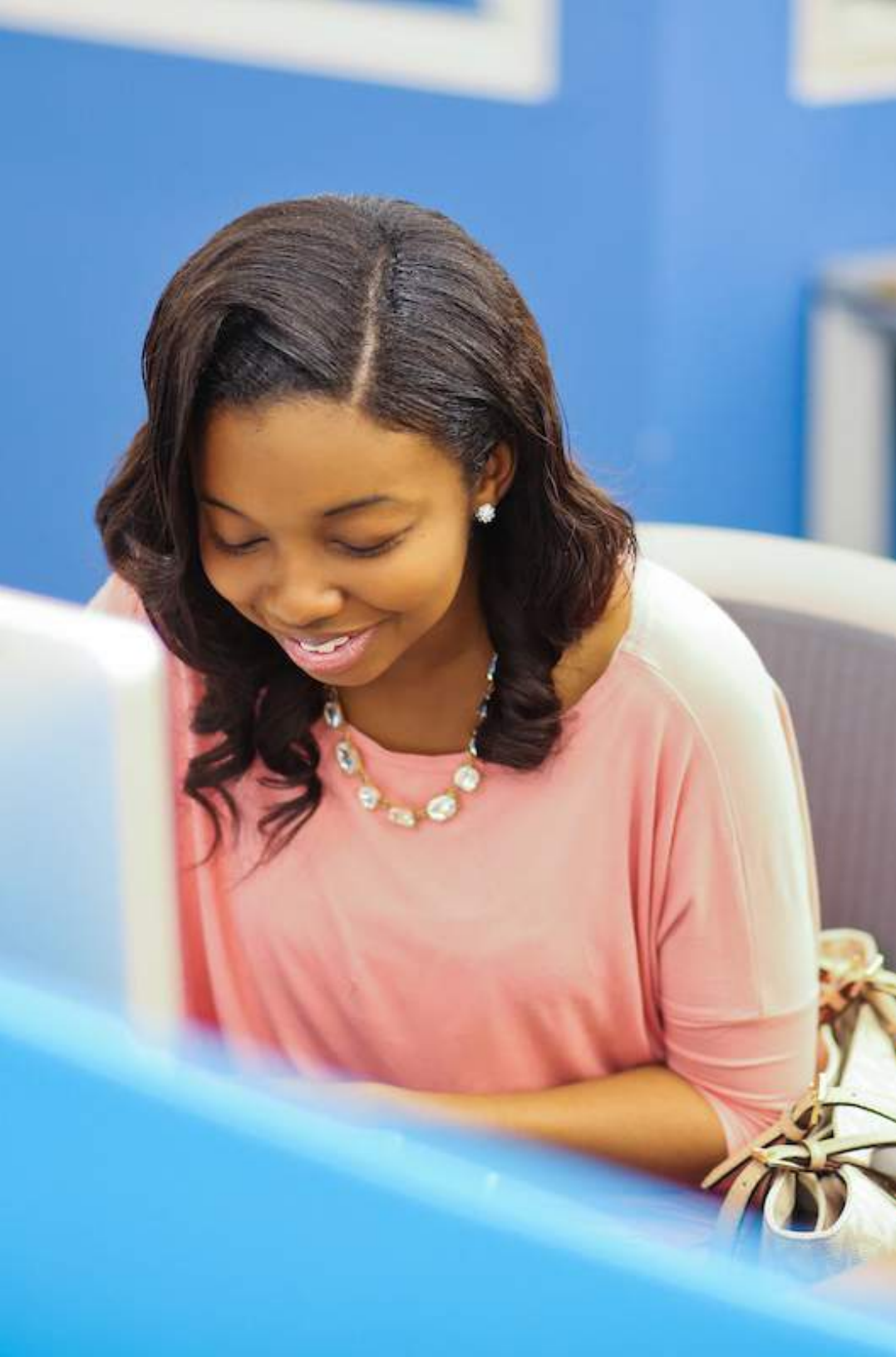
