

Job Placement Rates

The Department of Institutional Research and Assessment collects data from students who are graduating using a Student Exit Survey. This data is used to identify their plans after graduation as well as to gather information about employment. It can be seen from Table 4.1B below that over the past five years, the majority of the respondents received job offers each year. In fact, an overwhelming majority of those receiving offers each year received full-time offers. This information is made available at the academic department and college levels.
