

State Licensing Examination

Jackson State University's College of Education and Human Development requires students to take a licensure examination to obtain a degree in the Teacher Education Program. This program requires students to successfully pass the PRAXIS II examination. Student performance over the past five years is presented in **Table 1 and Table 2** below. It can be seen from this information that the number of students tested fluctuates. In **Table 1** scores ranging from a high of 60 students tested in years 2012-2013 and 2013-2014 to a low of 20 students tested in 2015-2016. Passage rates for students tested ranges from 82% to 100%. The most recent pass rate is 93% with 30 students who tested in 2018-19. In **Table 2** average scores in Speech-Language Pathology ranges from a high of 181 in the year 2016-17 to a low of 174 in the year 2015-16. The most recent average score in 2018-19 is 176.5. Since academic 2015-16, JSU has had a 100% passing rate on Praxis II in Speech-Language Pathology.
