### **OPENING PLENARY SESSION SPEAKER**



**Mrs. Diann Dawson** serves as the Director of the Regional Operations at the Administration for Children and Families (ACF), U.S. Department of Health and Human Services. She provides leadership for ACF's regional offices responsible for federal oversight and implementation of more than 60 human service programs to promote the well-being of children and families. As part of her present role, Mrs. Dawson provides regional support for the Healthy Marriage Initiative goals across the country.

Mrs. Dawson is the recipient of numerous awards including the Presidential Rank Award for Meritorious Service, which recognizes outstanding achievements by members of the Senior Executive Service. She is the 2008 recipient of the Distinguished Alumni Award from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill School of Social Work.

Mrs. Dawson received her J.D. degree from the Columbus School of Law at the Catholic University of America. **Judge William Skinner** is the Hinds County Youth Court Judge at the Henley-Young Juvenile Justice Center. Prior to being elected a judge, he served in various positions with the Jackson Police Department: police officer, training instructor, and trainer for the Special Weapons and Tactical Team. After being seriously injured in the line of duty, Judge Skinner retired from the Police Department. He enrolled in Mississippi College where he earned his M.S. degree in administration of justice. He subsequently earned his J.D. degree.

In December 2000, Judge Skinner was elected as a Hinds County Justice Court Judge. In November 2006, he was elected as the Hinds County Judge for District Four. Judge Skinner was instrumental in organizing a school that requires the detainees to work and receive counseling services. In addition, Judge Skinner serves as a youth court

judge overseeing hearings for the Mississippi Department of Human Services regarding abuse and neglect cases.
