Prior to Pandemic, Poverty Levels in Some Cities Were Slowly Improving

Despite Mississippi's ranking as one of the states with the highest poverty levels in the country¹ with a rate of 20.3%², poverty levels were gradually improving for some cities. **Figure 1** depicts those larger Mississippi cities in which the percentage of persons living below the poverty line decreased at rates between 3% and 10%. **Figure 2** depicts those larger Mississippi cities in which the percentage of persons living below the poverty line saw increases ranging between 0.5% to 3.1%. The values illustrated in Figures 1 and 2 were determined by calculating the difference in percentages reported in 2019 and 2015 American Community Survey data.

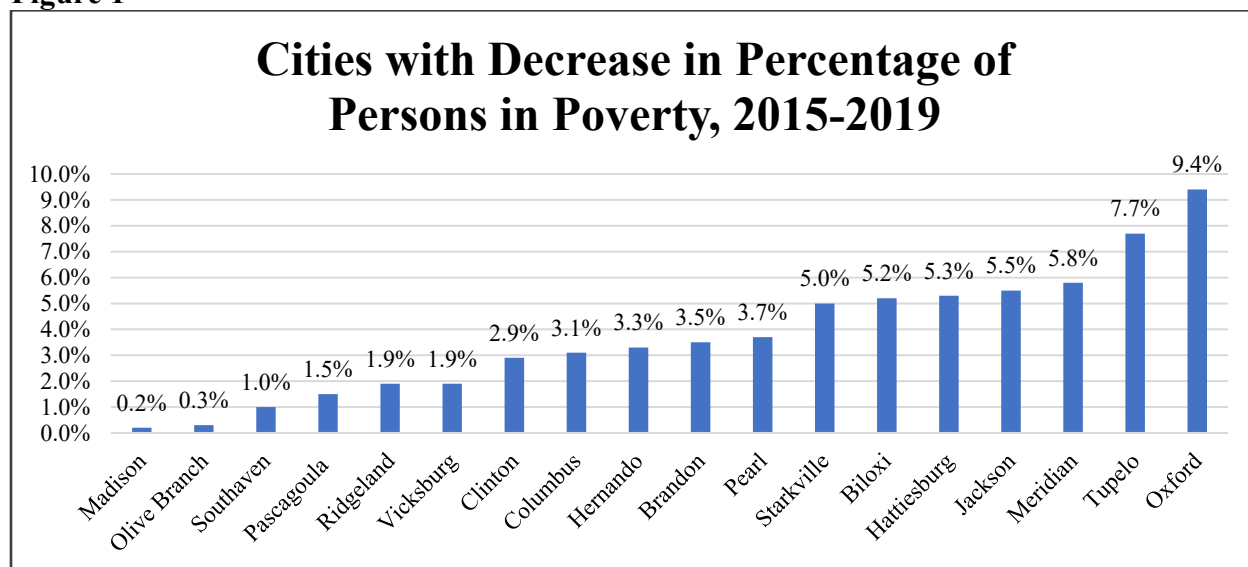
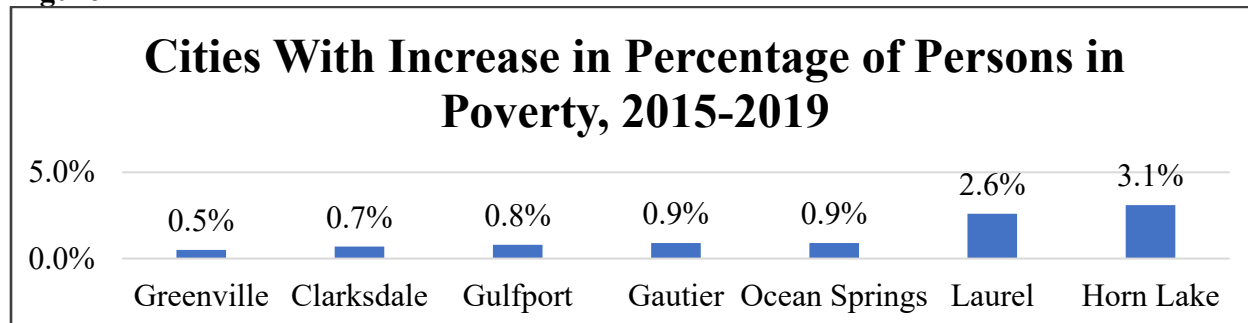
