#### **GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS**

- 1. Complete a minimum of 124 semester hours of coursework per the department curriculum sheet
- 2. Satisfactorily complete the curriculum requirements
- 3. Earn a cumulative grade point average of not less than 2.0 for all courses
- 4. Earn a grade point average of not less than 2.5 for all required psychology courses and all psychology electives
- 5. Complete in- residence, on the university campus, at least 30 semester hours of the required upper- level coursework in psychology
- 6. Complete in- residence, on the university campus, the final semester's coursework, unless permission is granted
- 7. Take **and** pass the departmental comprehensive psychology examination. Exam results must be posted prior to graduation clearance.
- 8. Satisfactorily pass the English Proficiency Examination. Failure of the exam will result in the student taking and passing ENG 399/Functional Writing. **Students** are required to take the UEPE at the end of their sophomore year and no later than the first semester of their junior year.
- 9. Complete the required community service hours.
- 10. Students entering the Psychology major after Spring 2014 are no longer required to take the GRE.
- 11. If two, consecutive foreign languages are taken in high school, with a grade of "C" and above, a student will be exempt from taking the foreign language requirement, provided that the information is posted on the student's transcript. Once that information is reflected, please be aware that those 6 credit hours would need to be replaced with alternate classes.
- 12. Make an appointment to see your advisor to make sure that your matriculation is on schedule for graduation in four years.
