Please send a 250-word abstract and a 75 word author bio to <u>editor.researcher@jsums.edu</u> by Oct. 1st 2018. Completed article-length manuscripts will be due February 15, 2019. Manuscripts should be in English, but quotation of primary sources can be in either Spanish or French. Manuscripts should be between 6,000-8,000 words in length with documentation in MLA format. Submit manuscripts to the general editor at <u>editor.researcher@jsums.edu</u>.

All papers will be peer-reviewed in a double-blind peer-review process. Accepted papers will be published in the Summer 2019 issue and will be listed on the special issue webpage.
