## **Bachelor of Social Work Program Admission Requirements**

### To be eligible for admission to the Social Work Program, students must have:

1. Completed any developmental courses required by the University;

- 2. Completed English 104 and presently enrolled in or have completed ENG 105: Composition & Literature with a minimum grade of "C" in each course;
- 3. Removed any Incomplete grades ("I") in courses; and
- 4. Achieved a minimum institutional grade point average (GPA) of 2.5 by the end of the semester which you are applying

## The B.S.W. Program's admissions application and process includes:

- 1. The completion of B.S.W. Admission Application form;
- 2. (2) Character references
- 3. Review and Read the Professional Expectations for Social Work Students;
- 4. Review and Read the Student Statement of Understanding;
- 5. A personal statement (Included on the Application Form)
- 6. Review and/or Attend Virtual Orientation

Under normal circumstances, the social work admissions process is completed during the 1st semester and 2nd semester of the sophomore year or during the 1st semester of the junior year. The application process occurs during the Fall **(October 15<sup>th</sup> Deadline)** and Spring **(February 15<sup>th</sup> Deadline)** semesters. Students are strongly encouraged to review and/or attend the virtual orientation relevant to the B.S.W. Program. The orientation provides information regarding student's interest in social work, their understanding of the values and ethics of the profession, B.S.W. Program curriculum, professionalism in the classroom and agency setting, and introduction to student organizations and activities.

The B.S.W. Admissions Committee implements the admissions process and is composed of full-time faculty in the Program. This committee reviews transcripts to ensure that students have met criteria for admission to the Program. Additionally, they review the personal statements and if necessary, conduct the admissions interviews. After the admissions decisions are made, students are notified in writing about their admissions status. Students must be fully admitted as social work majors prior to enrolling in SW 385: Social Work Practice I and subsequent social work practice courses.
