Standardized Tests (GRE, MCAT, MFT, PCAT, etc), Chemistry Exit Exam, Research Report, and Research Presentation are required before graduation.

Statistics Option Courses. One of the following courses: MATH 271 (Elementary Statistics), BIO 202 (Elementary Biostatistics), or PSY 211 (Statistics I).

<u>Criminal Justice Option Courses.</u> One of the following courses: CJ 326 (Issues and Procedures of Criminal Justice Research), CJ 443 (Foundation of Criminal Investigation), or CJ 445 (Introduction to Criminalistics).

<u>Forensic Practicum Option Courses.</u> Either CHEM 475 (Forensic Practicum) or three semesters of CHEM 380 (Independent Study). Student will need to start the Independent Study course sequence or applying for a forensic internship in the first semester of the junior year.

- C. Philosophy Option: One of following: PHIL 301, PHIL 308, PHIL 309, PHIL 416, MGMT 482, SW 210.
