(1) ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS (Page 236 of the Undergraduate Catalog)

The Bachelor of Science in Healthcare Administration (HCA) curriculum consists of 122 units of course work. The BS program admits freshmen and transfer students with an equivalent of seventy (70) hours from another accredited institution. Freshmen and sophomore students must maintain a GPA of 2.5 to remain in the HCA Program. Transfer students must have a 2.5 or higher grade point average to be admitted. Admission prerequisites for transfer students include courses in accounting, statistics, economics, and computer science. Admittance to the HCA Program is a two-step process. Interested students must first apply to JSU for admission. After admittance to JSU, all [freshmen and transfer] students must complete an application to the HCA Program. Application and our HCA brochure are located on the School of Public Health's website at http://www.jsums.edu/healthpolicy/.

(2) Each HCA course must be completed with a grade of "C" or better. A course in which a grade lower than "C" is received must be retaken and successfully completed prior to enrolling in any course for which it is a prerequisite. A student receiving a grade lower than a "C" may proceed with other courses for which it is not a prerequisite with approval of the Undergraduate Advisor.

(3) Curricular actions forms were sent to the Undergraduate Curriculum Committee in April 2019 to delete HCA 303 Medical and Administrative Terminology. HCA 381 Long-term Care Administration (now an elective) will become a required course. The name has also changed from "Long term & Mental Health" to Long-Term Care Administration.

(4) The Healthcare Administration electives are: HCA 340 - HCA of Ambulatory Services, HCA 365 - Hospital Acute Care Administration, HCA 498 Contemporary Issues in HCA and HCA 499 - Independent Studies. (4) HCA majors are allowed two substitutions of HCA core courses, except with *prior* approval from the Undergraduate Advisor. HCA 400.

(5) Refer to the Healthcare Administration Courses & Substitute Courses attachment (Degree Works). HCA 400 Healthcare Administration Internship and HCA 431 Health Professional Career Development Seminar (corequisites) cannot be substituted.
