## BACHELOR OF SCIENCE PUBLIC HEALTH

The Bachelor of Science in Public Health Program, housed in the Department of Health Policy & Management, provides a sound theoretical and practical education for public health practitioners. This program also will prepare students to enter the workforce in a number of jobs that fall under the public health umbrella; most include a focus on disease prevention and the promotion and protection of the health of a community either through education or policy advocacy. As part of the Public Health curriculum, students will have direct field experiences designed to prepare them for entry-level practice and supervisory positions in a range of public health organizations. Public Health undergraduates typically assume entry and middle-level position as community health planners, first responders, epidemiologists, public policymakers, public health physicians, public health nurses, and occupational and safety professionals.

In 2021, the median annual salary for healthcare administrators was approximately \$88,580 to \$93,910 (PublicHealth, 2021). The U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics has predicted that employment of Public Health Services Managers will grow by 18% over the next several years. The Bureau also projects an 11% growth in the role of Health Educators and Community Health Workers — much faster than other occupations (5%). Additionally, employment of medical and public health and health services managers is projected to grow 32 percent from 2020 to 2030, much faster than the average for all occupations. Hence, it is obvious that a career in the ever-growing field of public health is one that will present plenty of opportunities in for career growth and development in the future.

Electives	DPE or GEL	Electives are courses selected at a student's discretion and provide opportunities for students to pursue their academic interests. There are two types of electives. Degree Program Elective (DPE) courses are elective courses that are partially restricted such that students select courses from a specified group of identified courses (e.g., departmental elective courses) to fulfill a particular requirement. General Elective (GEL) courses are courses that may be selected from any program for which the student has fulfilled the proper prerequisites.					
Professional Concentrations	PC	Professional Concentration (PC) courses complement Degree Program Required courses and allow students to have a concentrated area of study within the major.
